

Serious Infection and Critical Care in Children - diagnosis and management at the front-line

3 - 4 April 2014

This two-day course gives healthcare professionals who see acutely unwell children a practical and evidence based approach to diagnosis and management of a wide range of infections.



This course aims to provide a thorough understanding of the regular pitfalls in the diagnosis of infection and will highlight the life threatening consequences of such errors.

Areas covered will include:

- Recognition of the unwell child
- Cognitive bias and clinical decision making
- Bugs and drugs
- The management of sepsis
- Interactive workshops including; management of the child presenting with fever and respiratory distress, rash, an unexplained limp or abnormal neurology



The course runs for two days but Day 1 can be taken as a stand-alone course. Some of the teaching will be done in small group workshops using real cases to illustrate the differential diagnosis, investigation and optimal management of a variety of common paediatric presentations.



Designed for anyone that sees children at the front-line; GP's, triage nurses, A+E doctors, paediatric nurses and paediatric trainees.
